



Come to an information session to find out about benefit and credit payments you could get from the Canada Revenue Agency if you do your taxes every year.

GARBAGE BAG TAG

Did you know we sell garbage tags?
Residents setting out more than four bags of garbage on collection day are required to buy tags for each bag over the limit. The Uxbridge Public Library sells sheets of 10 garbage bags for \$25, or \$2.50 per tag.
